FY12 Awards

**Forensic Firearms Testing/NIBIN**

AZ Department of Public Safety \$40,000  
Funding to support personnel to reduce backlog of firearms evidence waiting to be entered into NIBIN as well as entering images of new bullets and casings recovered from crime scenes and bullets and casings resulting from test firing of crime guns.

Apache Junction Police Department \$ 5,000  
Funding will be used to pay officer overtime to test fire guns for entry into the Phoenix Police Department NIBIN program.

Glendale Police Department \$11,269  
Funding will be used to pay officer overtime to test fire guns for entry into the Phoenix Police Department NIBIN program.

Maricopa County Sheriff's Office \$27,427  
Funding will be used to pay officer overtime and personnel to enter data in NIBIN and reduce backlog of firearm related evidence awaiting processing in the NIBIN system.

Mesa Police Department \$13,476  
Funding will be used to pay officer overtime and personnel to enter data in NIBIN and reduce backlog of firearm related evidence awaiting processing in the NIBIN system.

Tucson Police Department \$16,086  
Funding for overtime and training to perform NIBIN evidence preparation, imaging and data entry for the NIBIN program.

**Gun Intelligence Support Operations**

Flagstaff Police Department \$10,000  
Funding for officer overtime for enforcement efforts and to provide gang and gun violence prevention outreach efforts in the community.

Pima County Adult Probation \$ 6,265  
Funding for the purchase of bullet proof vests for nine probation officers assigned to supervise gang and gun offenders.

**Community Outreach & Education**

Sunnyside Weed & Seed - Flagstaff \$ 9,525  
Funding for a reentry program coordinated with the Coconino County Probation Office to provide services to gang and gun offenders released back to the community.

Tucson Police Department \$22,100  
Funding to support the Gang Outreach Unit that provides education resources to the community on gang and gun crime and presentations to schools, community groups and youth to address gang involvement and discourage an environment where gangs thrive.

**Media Partner**

Arizonans for Gun Safety (AzFGS) \$39,990  
The media partner is funded to work closely with the US Attorney's Office and PSN funded projects to develop gun violence prevention campaigns utilized in the community.
