I. WELCOME/ADMINISTRATIVE/AGENDA

The Arizona Criminal Justice Commission announced a call for project proposals due to a de-obligation of approximately twenty-three thousand dollars in federal grant funding.

II. ARIZONA NICS TASK FORCE (2012-2017)

Anthony Coulson, Marc Peoples, and Aaron Gorrell, Waterhole Consulting, reviewed the NICS Task Force Accomplishments from 2013 to 2017. The Performance Measurement Chart was reviewed, with a discussion on top arrest offense categories and Failure to Appear charges on disposition submission types and ADRS web and XML submission. The NICS Task Force Recommendations and Actions steps were presented.

III. FBI NICS

A call with FBI NICS was held to discuss requirements for submitting information regarding arrest warrants, prohibited possessor statute, and classification of fugitive from justice.

It was announced that there would be a NICS conference taking place from August 28-29th in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

IV. PROJECT BRIEFINGS

- a. **Juvenile Felony Delinquent**
The Arizona Office of the Courts has developed a workgroup to identify juvenile prohibited possessor reporting criteria into NICS.
- b. **Involuntary Commitment for Drug Treatment**
There is currently no statutory authority that prohibits the possession of a firearm for an individual who has been involuntarily committed for drug treatment.
- c. **Fugitive From Justice**
When under indictment, a person cannot get a CCW permit, but they are not a prohibited possessor. ARS 13-03112(E)(3) prevents CCW for indictment
- d. **FDR/ADRS/Missing Dispositions**
Some prosecutor offices are not receiving FDRs, and there are limitations with ADRS. DPS is working on a system that will allow ORIs to log in and download a report with missing dispositions.
- e. **Felony Conviction to NICS**
The Arizona Office of the Courts is in the process of reviewing their system design.
- f. **Conditions of Release**
The AOC researched to see how the COR forms would look. The goal is to have a uniform COR form by late 2018.
- g. **Order of Protection/Injunction Against Harassment Project**
First discovery meeting with AOC/DPS in July 2018 to examine the framework around OP/IAH.
Forms to be served will electronically be transmitted to a service agency. One major issue in situations where there is no address for service
- h. **E-Warrant**
Glendale implemented a new AJACS platform with a successful e-warrant component. The barrier with Glendale's e-warrant system is figuring out a statewide price point with the vendor that Glendale uses for their e-warrant system.
July 2018: Law enforcement will be able to request a blood draw for DUI twenty-four hours a day, statewide.
- i. **Adult Probation**
Attempting to automate the risk assessment further so that LJ courts can generate scores
- j. **Mobile Fingerprinting**
Phase I of the project is complete.
Phase II of the project is in progress
- k. **Live Scan Replacement**
ACJC has available grant funding for courts interested in having a live scan or needing a current live scan replaced

V. New Projects/Future Plan

- Continue with workgroup discussions around juvenile submissions to NICS
- Work with warrant entering agencies to educate on entering warrants into NCIC
- The next NICS Taskforce meeting will take place October 16, 2018.
