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# EWARRANT STATUS REPORT

## BACKGROUND

- A 2013 study revealed that there are well over 100 different arrest warrants templates in use across Arizona. This creates significant training issues during both the entry and execution of arrest warrants.
- In 2015, the AOC established a single warrant format that is to be used across Arizona. Through Training and Technical Assistance sessions funded through NCHIP, the AOC would assist courts in planning for their implementation of this statewide standard.

## DEVELOPMENT

- Since August 2019, weekly group meetings have been held among those law enforcement agencies and their court counterparts that are participating in this project.
- Extensive discussions were done on making a cohesive and cross agency warrant template that would be understandable and useable for all agencies involved

## Current Status of Project

- All following Law Enforcement agencies are live on JWI as a part of this project:
- Prescott PD, Yavapai SO, Coconino SO, and Mohave SO, Glendale PD
- The following Law Enforcement Agencies are either in testing or in the works to participate in JWI testing
- Lake Havasu PD and Prescott Valley PD
- The following AJACS Courts have eWarrant interface turned on:
- Prescott Municipal, Prescott Justice, Flagstaff Justice Court
- The following AJACS Courts are on hold or pending final testing:
- Glendale Municipal Court is waiting to complete testing of existing outstanding warrants with the PD before they are agreeable to switch over to the new interface
- Mohave and Yavapai are waiting on the warrant stamp fix in AJACS before they will go live
- Lake Havasu Court is participating in initial testing
- Prescott Valley Court has not yet agreed/responded to want to participate in eWarrant as of yet (Susann to follow up with Judge Carson)

## FUTURE PLANS

- AOC have sent an email to DPS requesting a planning meeting to have DPS implement JWI/eWarrant to allow our Pilot Courts to electronically report warrants to DPS. This meeting will take place September 18, 2020.
- Looking to also expand to other law enforcement agencies once all the pilots are completely up and running to use as examples for other agencies

# Arizona Supreme Court

## 2FID STATUS REPORT

### BACKGROUND

- The two-fingerprint identification (2FID) mobile device electronically validates existence of a defendant's fingerprints in the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and whether an AFIS Record Number (ARN) exists. A positive response indicates to the court that the defendant's fingerprints were taken previously. A negative, "no ARN hit," response informs the court the defendant must be sent for fingerprinting at a booking facility.
- Phase 1 standardizes the last page on the sentencing order for the fingerprint enabling all AJACSS courts to submit high quality prints to Arizona Dept. of Corrections following sentencing.
- Phase II verifies the person being sentenced is charged correctly and has prints on file for the specific charges being sentenced. (arrest date query to ADRS)

### IMPLEMENTATION

- The following counties have opted in for 2FID device implementations managed by the AOC: Apache, Cochise, Coconino, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, La Paz, Mohave, Navajo, Pinal, Santa Cruz, Yavapai, Yuma, and Maricopa. However 3 counties are currently not utilizing the devices for Phase I: Coconino, La Paz, Santa Cruz.

### PROJECT STATS

- Deployed 173 2FID devices in the Superior Court locations to date and used them for 93,654 individuals at sentencing.
- Discovered 923 people were missing 10 prints at the time of sentencing. (They have no criminal history due to no 10 prints on file)
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### CURRENT STATUS OF PROJECT

- We had contracted with Pragmatica and completed programming to add the Arrest Date field within the MOBS application.
- We have completed programming for Phase II of project in which AZAFIS is queried for the presence of a 10 print and a YES response triggers a second query to ADRS to verify the arrest date for the prints found in AZAFIS however have not deployed due to other high priority projects.
- The only change for the Courts' interface in the MOBS application to include entry for arrest date.
- I'm receiving other inquiries regarding getting the devices setup in courtroom Jails. One device is currently being utilized in Cochise County per the Presiding judge to avoid contact at time of sentencing.
- We have a meeting scheduled Monday 8/24 with Pinal to discuss 2FID in ADC facilities for Pinal County.
