

ACJC NICS Task Force Meeting

October 8, 2019

Meeting Notes

Meeting start: 8:37am

- **AZ POINT (Arizona Point of Initiation and Notification Tool)**
 - Gateway into the courts
 - Strictly internet based: if you have access to the internet, you have access to the tool
 - In depth explanation of the step by step process, how it will be changing in January
 - Mesa Court question: How are we able to manage the growing list of orders in the queue? – the new system will prompt them every 30 days to obtain more information to facilitate the service of the order
 - Arizona Supreme court will be the holder of the record
 - Explanation of the parts of the website, what the safety button is, show the application process
 - Suggested to move Spanish assistance closer to the top
 - Review schedule for the next trainings across the state
- **E-Warrants – statewide electronic warrant repository**
 - Glendale created it and piloting it – own resources and time to facilitate their warrant process
 - Pragmatic is the vendor for the project
 - AJACS/JWI statewide process
 - Five pilot participants: Coconino County Sheriff, Mohave County Sheriff, Yavapai County Sheriff, Prescott Consolidated Court, Glendale
 - 30 day offer to still join the pilot project
- **Conditions of Release**
 - Every court in the state issues these, other courts currently do not have access to these conditions
 - A committee will be assembled to discuss legal issues, process issues, recommendations
 - December 4th meeting to come out with a cohesive plan, available before Christmas
 - Pilots hopefully starting in early 2020
 - This will make Form 4 electronic since every law enforcement office uses it
 - Unique number on the conditions of release to follow that individual and not change when it travels from one location to another
 - Items to look at in the future meetings: types of crimes, timeline for filing charges for certain crimes, clean up recommendations at the December 4th meeting
- **Mobile Fingerprinting**
 - Phase 2 is going well, pulling PCN and SID is working, now testing how to get the information back into AJACS
 - A couple bugs on the AJACS side
 - 173 mobile fingerprinting units deployed across the state
 - We want to open this up to Municipal Courts, email if interested
 - 76K prints taken so far, 768 came back with no prints on file
- **ADRS implementation with prosecutors**
 - Has fallen off the wagon temporarily
 - Maricopa County Attorney Office is live and working
 - We are working through getting PCNS
 - Pinal Co is sending electronically to DPS

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- Yavapai and Coconino are getting close to testing
- Apache will be next
- Pima is using a dot net environment, hopefully learn from Pinal County's code who also is using dot net environment
- This process will move the disposition sheet electronically through the process
- So far focus is on superior courts, municipal and justice courts will follow
- One issue that came up was county to county about "No files" (NF) being sent to PD rather than city prosecutors
- Felony Conviction to NICS update
 - Fingerprints need to be taken!!
 - 90 days for the fingerprints to catch up to cases
- Juvenile Felony Delinquent Reporting
 - AZ does not currently report juvenile cases
 - When do rights become restored? Rules are being developed currently to make this an electronic process
 - Mid-February all the issues should be resolved and become functional
 - Who qualifies and who should be taken out of the system? – about 3 to 4k individuals fit into this
 - Reported into the NICS indexes, not III or ACJIS
 - All Police records will be soon available to all NICS examiners
- Mental Health Disposition Issues
 - Tucson PD have confirmed a suspended/revoked CCW was used in a murder of a US Marshal officer
 - Mental health laws have not been updated since the 1960s in AZ
 - Personality disorder will be added into the mental health adjudication
 - Rule 11 is being updated
 - We will be expanding the conversation on suspended and revoked CCWs on how law enforcement can know to obtain those from the individuals that have not surrendered them volutarily
 - Legislative change most likely needed for CCW update, sellers need to be able to enter CCW numbers to verify if they are valid or not
